This move which will directly result in MPA Skills being able to offer even more mature age apprentices an opportunity to start working and training immediately and meet the demands of plumbing and painting businesses in WA.

MPA Skills CEO Mr Ben Dahlstrom, said that this and other initial areas of action from the government are positive for the apprenticeship training and employment sector.

"We know that this a challenging time for plumbing and painting companies in WA who are faced with a critical shortage of apprentices to help their businesses grow and take advantage of current market conditions," said Mr Dahlstrom.

"Alongside the Mature-Age incentive, it is encouraging to see the direct assistance for Aboriginal jobseekers through the Wirrpanda Foundation and critical support for disadvantaged learner drivers to obtain their driver's licence. This is of particular importance to young apprentices who often face an added barrier to employment by not being able to drive.

"MPA Skills acknowledges the swift response of Premier McGowan and Minister Ellery who have moved quickly to support the training sector with these initiatives and thanks both for their efforts in this critical area," added Mr Dahlstrom.
